- It is very important that all students take these tests. Students should be absent only in extreme emergencies. Please make sure your child gets plenty of rest and a good breakfast on these test days.

- Core academic teachers are reviewing assessment data and student samples to determine which students need a review of the Standards of Learning for their respective course. Individual teachers will contact home (via email or phone) for students who are recommended for these review sessions.

Technology Connected Learning Project

In keeping with Thoreau's continuous drive toward being on the cutting edge of educational best practices that support student achievement, Thoreau has been given a great opportunity to participate in a grant funded Technology Connected Learning Project. This innovative project will allow us to issue each student on the Duck team a Netbook for use at home and at school. As you know, electronic devices and information access are embedded in our students' lives, therefore, we believe it is critical for us to also help students learn to navigate, acquire, discern, and use these tools to support their learning. We are very excited to be moving forward with this project and it has been great to see the enthusiasm of the students.

MAKE THE CUT - Thoreau Students to Cut Their Hair for Others!

In conjunction with preparations for the Spring Musical, *Thoroughly Modern Millie* – set in the 1920s when young women cut and bobbed their hair – The Drama Department, the SCA and the PTA will be sponsoring an exciting charity event here at Thoreau: a hair-cutting party. They will be partnering with Pantene Beautiful Lengths, a charity campaign in association with the American Cancer Society, which encourages people to grow, cut and donate their healthy hair to create real-hair wigs for women who have lost their hair due to cancer treatment. More specifically, this event is being held to honor 8th grader and musical cast member Lija Lusia, who is currently battling Hodgkin's Lymphoma.

The goal is to sign up at least 50 (hopefully more!) Thoreau students to cut and donate their hair in support of Lija and thousands of others. The event will take place on Friday night, March 23, from 7:00 – 9:00 p.m. in Thoreau's cafeteria and gym. To be eligible to donate, hair must be:

- at least 8 inches long (no maximum length) – if curly or wavy, measure when straight;
- Free of permanent color, bleach, or other chemical treatments

Hair will first be ponytailed and cut by a family member or other adult sponsor; it will then be styled for free by volunteer stylists recruited from area hair salons (or donors may choose to visit their own salon after the event for finishing). Pledging will begin in the next week or so during lunches; students must have a permission slip to participate signed by a parent/guardian, and guidelines for preparing one's hair in the coming weeks will be handed out. Each girl who "makes the cut" will receive a t-shirt for their generosity.
